

R E S O L U T I O N

Laid before the House of Representatives of the United States, on Monday the 7th of April, 1794, by Mr. Clarke.

RESOLVED, That until the government of Great Britain shall cause restitution to be made for all losses and damages sustained by the citizens of the United States, from armed vessels, or from any person or persons acting under commission or authority of the British king, contrary to the laws of nations, and in violation of the rights of neutrality; and also, until all the posts, now held and detained by the king of Great Britain, within the territories of the United States, shall be surrendered and given up, all commercial intercourse, between the citizens of the United States, and the subjects of the king of Great Britain, so far as the same respects articles of the growth or manufacture of Great Britain or Ireland, shall be prohibited; provided such prohibition shall not extend to vessels, or their cargoes, arriving in any of the ports of the United States, before the day of next.
