

CONNELL, Hon. CHARLES. [*Carleton, N.B.*]

B. of Charles Connell, Esq., a native of Conn., U.S., who removed at an early age to N.B., and settled on the site of Northampton, Co. Carleton. B. and ed there. M., 1835, Ann, dau. of Peter Fisher, Esq. Is a Justice of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, Co. Carleton, N.B., and a dir. of the Quebec and N.B. Railway Co. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, N.B., and Postmaster-Genl. from 1859 to 1860. Surveyor-Genl. from 1860 to 1867, and also a mem. of the Board of Works for some years. Sat in the L.C. of N.B. from 1849 to 1861, when he resigned. Represented Carleton in N. B. Assembly from 1848 to 1849, and again from 1861 until the Union. Returned to Commons by acclamation. A Liberal.—*Woodstock, N.B.*

CORRIHAN, JOHN, J.P. [*Victoria, N.B.*]

B. at St. Nicholas, Q., 1 Feb., 1835. Ed. at St. Ann's College. M., 1855, Miss Ryan, of Victoria, N.B. Has been Registrar of Deeds for Victoria, and Judge of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas, N.B. Sat for present seat in N.B. Assembly from 1861 to 1866, when defeated. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of the present Govt.—*Grand Falls, N.B.*
