

viz:—Land line on the north shore of St. Lawrence—Extension from Pointe aux Esquimaux, eastward, \$12,000; Telegraph line between Margaree and Chéticamp—Repoling, \$1,000; Telegraph lines, Ontario—Removal of Pelee Island cable from Pigeon Bay, and relaying of same via Dummy light, \$1,500; Telegraph lines, British Columbia—To provide for an alternative line connecting Cape Beale and Carmenah with Victoria by extending the French Creek—Alberni line, southwardly to the south-west coast of Vancouver Island, \$5,000, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

41. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Four thousand seven hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Miscellaneous items, as follow:—National Art Gallery—Additional amount required, \$1,000; Monument to Champlain in the City of Quebec—Contribution, \$3,000; To provide for one-half of the salary of the Departmental photographer, the other half of his salary having been provided for by the Department of Railways and Canals, \$700, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

42. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven dollars and sixty-four cents be granted to Her Majesty, for Public Works:—Telegraph line between Prince Edward Island and the main line, \$973.33; Land and cable lines of the sea coasts and islands of the lower river and Gulf of St. Lawrence and the Maritime Provinces, including cost of working steamer “Newfield” or other vessels when required for cable service, \$904.31, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

43. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-one thousand one hundred and thirty-seven dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Post Office—To provide for the difference between \$14,118.50, the amount due to the Canadian Pacific Railway Company under Order in Council, 19th February, 1896, until the 30th June, 1896, on a re-adjustment of the rates on various branches, and \$7,100 the amount voted last Session, \$7,018.50; To provide for the amount to become due the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, for the year ending 30th June, 1897, under Order in Council, 19th February, 1896, \$14,118.50, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

44. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Eight thousand and eight dollars and seventeen cents be granted to Her Majesty, for Railways and Canals:—Intercolonial Railway—To provide water-closets and sewerage at Rimouski, \$200; Beauharnois Canal—Repairs (repairing wall at upper entrance), \$1,000; To refund overpayment of rent on lot of land, \$30.67; Lachine Canal—To pay J. B. Papineau wages during the time he was laid up from injuries received while on duty on 10th July, 1895, 143 days, at \$1.25 per diem, \$178.75; To pay Messieurs. W. & G. H. Tate for putting vessels in dry dock and wintering them, \$410.62; Cornwall Canal—Repairs (general), \$1,000; Williamsburg Canals—Repairs (general), \$600; St. Anne’s Lock—Repairs (general), \$400; Carillon and Grenville Canal—Repairs (general), \$400; Rideau Canal—Staff, \$250; Repairs, \$1,020; To pay William Doran for time lost while laid up from injuries received while on duty in May, 1895, 14½ days at \$1.25 per diem, \$18.13—\$1,288.13; Chambly Canal—Repairs (general), \$1,000; Murray Canal—Repairs (general), \$1,000; Dredge vessels, Rideau Canal—Repairs to scows, \$500, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

The said Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to.

Mr. Brodeur reported from the Committee of Supply, several Resolutions; which were read, as follow:—

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Four thousand one hundred and seventy-eight dollars and forty-two cents be granted to Her Majesty, for Ocean and River Service—Dominion Steamers—To pay cost of hauling steamer “Quadra” off Fullford Reef and towing into Victoria Harbour, as agreed upon between agent of the Department and captain of tug-boat, \$4,000; To pay costs of litigation connected with the steamer “Druid,” \$178.42, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-three thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Lighthouse and Coast Service—To provide for the establishment of a fog alarm at Belle Isle, \$20,000; To provide for two gas buoys on Lake Erie, \$3,500, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.
