

Carleton and Yorkers Hand Varsity 6-1 Drubbing

Thursday night at York Arena the injury and exam-riddled Varsity puck chasers proved no match for the hockey-wise Saint John Carleton & Yorkers as it absorbed a 6-1 drubbing in the first game of a best-in-five semi-final series. Changes were numerous in the U.N.B. lineup. Pike and Ballantyne, preparing for two finals, were replaced by Kelly and Plummer respectively, while Gaudet and Bob Bliss, both sidelined with injuries, made way for Donkin and Smith. Three of the above replacements went into unfamiliar positions, 1-wing Kelly, centre Donkin and defenceman Smith filling in on the right wing spots.

PLAYOFF HOCKEY

The hockey was the typical play-off type, close checking, few penalties and a scarcity of shots on goal. Both netminders worked well, Gerry Lynch being deprived of a shut-out with only three minutes of play remaining. It was only fitting that Geo. Steele, captain of the Varsity squad, should tally it, for he never worked better, rushing superbly and covering up effectively.

Saint John Superior

In the first two periods the Saint John squad displayed neat passing which culminated in five goals without reply. The Yorkers seemed to coast along and were given plenty of scope to do so by a UNB team which showed a lack of organization. In the third session the Red and Black first line of Kelly, Malone and Lorimer worked overtime, Smith dropped back on defence and the result was a period in which Saint John was held to one goal.
