Dear Sir:-

Your letter of 21st instant addressed to John Stuart, County Clerk, has been forwarded by him to me. The County are getting from him the right to enter and take gravel from in and on land, as the gravel is being used to a large extent upon roads in the vicinity of the reserve. I understand that the band desires that the gravel should be taken. The allowance to Fox is for the right of entry upon the premises and for the damage and inconvenience done to him thereby, and not by way of payment for the gravel. This being the fact it does not seem to me that he should be chargeable for dues as the band are really contributing the gravel with a view of having the roads in the vicinity of the reserve improved. I shall be pleased to receive from you the necessary *approval* by the Department of Indian Affairs to this transaction.
