expected to render all medical and surgical aid required by the Indians referred to who call upon you, as well as to attend to any cases which may be brought to your notice by the Indian Agent, Mr W.T.A. Donohus, of Points Bleus. You will be expected to furnish all medicines required for treating the Indians in question, and should you at any time either through illness of absence be unable to attend to your duties as medical officer to those Indians you will be expected to supply a substitute.

Your salary will be paid quarterly , and you

appointment will date from the 1st March next.
