Ottawa, 23rd. February, 1914.

Sir:-

with reference to the subject of assistance granted to ex-pupils of your agency, I beg to say that if Egerton Saultaux does not make good use of the oxen supplied him by the Department you should take the animals away from him, and make report of the fact to Head-quarters.

The Department can not find any trace of the receipt from you of agreements signed by Saultaux and Nathaniel Sunday in connection with oxen, etc., furnished them. You were instructed to have, in each case, an agreement signed and forwarded to the Department. You should give this matter your immediate attention. You should also inform the Department of the value of the oxen, etc., which Nathaniel Sunday received in order that his account may be correctly kept at Head-quarters.
