Authorities that this soldier was tried by Standing Authorities that this soldier was tried by Standing court-Martial on the Sth February, 1945 on a charge of absenting himself without leave from the 11th July, 1944 until apprehended on the 14th July, 1944 and on a further charge of desertion, having absented and on a further charge of desertion, having absented himself without leave from the 28th July, 1944 until apprehended the 23rd January, 1945, dressed in civilian apprehended the 23rd January, 1945, dressed in civilian clothes. He was found guilty of the offences and was sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for eighteen manths and to be discharged with ignominy from his months and to be discharged with ignominy from his Majesty's Service.

Sentences ewarded by Military Courts are reviewed at regular intervals with a view to remission or suspension when the conduct and industry of the soldier and the interests of military discipline warrant.

In this instance, due to this soldier's long absence and his many previous convictions, it is not contemplated that there will be any remission at this time.
