HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 3 and 56, which has not been homestended, or reserved to provide wood to the cetters, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the homesteaded upon by any person who is the homesteaded that have been applied to the property of the property of

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the loss land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or it the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for Lina. HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A sottler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plane:—

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining petert many be actisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner pra-serbed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by registering upon the first homestead, if the originary upon the first homestead, if the homestead, is the boundary of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provision. Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 series of his homestead, or substitute 30 head of stors, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 50 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law it hisble to have his entry cancelled, and the law may be sgain thrown open for entry.
