

who intend building medium-priced houses.—A 40-foot lot on Bloor street, just west of Bedford road, has been purchased and on the site will be erected a five-storey building, to be let in flats.—St. George's Society have adopted a proposal to erect a monument in Allan Gardens in memory of William Shakespeare.—The Canadian Horse Breeders' Association, at their annual meeting last week, decided to negotiate with the Union Stock Yards' Co., of Toronto Junction, for a site on which to erect an arena for the holding of horse shows and stabling accommodation. The cost is placed at \$60,000. Particulars from Henry Wade, secretary treasurer.—The Council of the Ontario College of Pharmacy are offering their large building on Gerrard street for sale, with the object of erecting a more commodious building on another site.—The plans recommended by City Engineer for the improvement of the water supply calls for an expenditure of \$960,193 and include the following items: Tunnel across the bay, \$325,000; 6-foot steel conduit, \$200,000; 5,000,000 gallon engine, \$50,000; concreting reservoir, \$35,000; 36-inch main on Bathurst, from College to reservoir, \$190,011; 24-inch main on Front street, Church to Sumach and then to Queen, \$55,394; 20-inch main, high level station to St. George street, \$8,308; 16-inch main on St. George street and Queen street east, \$24,813; 12-inch main on Strachan avenue, \$10,604, and on Queen street west, \$6,464; new meters, \$50,000.—The Board of Control has endorsed the recommendation of the Works Committee for a brick pavement on Dundas street, from Bloor to city limits, at cost of \$17,180.—E. J. Lennox, architect, has been commissioned to prepare plans for the reconstruction of the extensive dry goods store of the T. Eaton Co. The work will commence with the Yonge street front, where two storeys will

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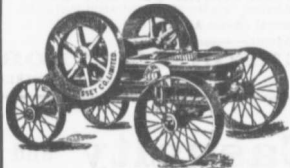
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
