## THE GUIDE'S OTTAWA SERVICE

Since the Western farmers have taken such a determined stand for just and progressive federal legivlation, it is neeessary that they slall know what transpires in the Ilouse of Commons from week to week. For this reason The Guide will have a special representative at Ottawa this winter in the person of Mr. J. W. Ward. A weekly letter will be written by Mr. Ward for us from an impartial standpoint, and he will deal with the national questions and with our members of parliament and their public actions without fear or favor. Our representative will have no connection whatever with any partisan political paper, and will be absolutely free to present facts in their true light without eoloring them to suit special interests. The Western Canadian people have been landicapped for many years through not being able to sceure an independent report of proceedings in the Ilouse of Commons. We believed that it was due our readers to give them this, and even if the expense is heavy, we believe the service will be greatly appreciated. Our readers may expect in our weekly Ottawa letter something of vital interest to every man in Western Canada. If Western Canadian farmers are going to sceure reform of present ahuses, they must know how these aluses ereep into our system, and what methods to pursue to prevent them. It will be of interest to our readers to know that our representative is a believer in the priseiples of free trade as it is practiced in England, and will therefore view tariff questions from a safe vantage point.

## DISCUSS BOUNDARY QUESTION

Ottawa, November 14.-I'remier Roblin, of Manitola, whu is in the eapital, had a confereuce with Sir Wilfrid
laurier this morning in respeet to the Manituba houndary quention. The two premiers diselussed the matter for some time, but nothing was given out suhsequently. I'remier Roblin goes to New York and will return to otrawa in a few days, when the confereare will be resumest. It is understond that Mr. Rublin laial hefore Sir IVilfrid a plaa wherchy Outario will he giveu aecess to a port on II uilson's Bay.
It is not improbuble that an agreement will he rearlied and the long delayed boundary extension fut through
this session of parliameut.
