These official figures do not include the pillaging in the country, nor do they give the number of military executions, or arrests of agitators and revolutionists, and there are no figures showing the

The St. Petersburg Gazette sys that 2,360 persons were banished of Saturday from St. Petersburg alone, and that 750 were claced on trains bound for the interior.
