A Royal Reception.

Lieutenant Leon Archibald of the Royal Engineers, and son of Mrs. R. deW. Archibald of this town, who is recovering slowly from wounds and shell-shock received during the Somme engagement last July, was lately chosen one of three Canadian representatives at a royal reception tendered colonial officers at Buckingham Palace. There were about one hundred officers present. They were entertained with moving pictures in the Throne Room for an hour after which tea was served and they were presented personally to their Majesties King George and Queen Mary, and to Princess Mary, Princess Patricia and the Duke of Connaught with each of whom they were accorded an audience of about five minutes. Before they left they were given signed photographs of their royal host and hostess. Lieut. Archibald is still unfit for active service and will be sent home on furlough to finish his recuperation. He has been serving in Khaki since August, 1914.
