Attempted Murder of Presient Garfield.

HE IS SHOT IN THE BREAST.

The Assassin a Discharged Ex-

THE LATEST ABOUT HIS CONDITION.

(Special to the Mercury per Dominson Line.)

Naw Yons, July 2nd.

President Garfield while purchasing a ticket in the Baltimore and Potomac depot at Washington this morning was shot. The assassin has been arrested. No particulars can be ascertained at this how. The wound is feared to be a fatal one,

New York, July 2nd, 1881.

Another report says General Garfield is dead, but a later report contradicted this and says he is not dead, but badly injured.

FOURTH DESPATCH.

President Garfield was shot twice in the right breast, at 9:30 this a.m., at B. & P. depot.

The name of the assassin is said to be Guiteau, of Uhicago, ex-Consul of Mar-seilles.

SIXTH DESPATCH.

The President has just been taken the White House in an ambulance under guard of mounted police. The excitement is intense.


