DAISY WILKES WON AT HALIFAX

The Fredericton Mare in Fine Fettle and Showed Her Heels to the Field—Sir George Won the 2.20 Class.

Halifax, N.S., Sept. 27.—The running race at the Dominion Exhibition today was captured in straight heats by Avon Lass, the Windsor entry. Sir George, the favorite in the betting, won the 2.20 trot in three straight heats in slow time and for the first time since the start of the races the talent got a tumble, as Daisy Wilkes, third choice in the pools, won the 2.25 trot and pace in three straight heats.

Warren F., the Boston horse, who was a strong favorite in the betting, could do no better than second. The time for this race was very good, the second heat being equal to the fastest heat trotted in the twenty class.

While nearing the home stretch in the running race Thomas Robinson's bay gelding, Amoldus, interferred and broke his leg above the ankle.

In the 2.25 trot and pace all the horses were well bunched with first one and then another ahead. Warren F. went to the front at the three-quarter with Daisy Wilkes close up. The Fredericton mare gradually drew ahead and finished easily with Warren F. second and Frank Krohn third.

Peter Carroll took Frank Krohn, the Sydney gelding, to the front and kept him there till well into the second half when first Warren F. and shortly after Daisy Wilkes again overhauled and passed him. Daisy again won easily and the two geldings fought it out tooth and nail for second place. Fox reached the wire first with Warren F. and Peter Carroll with Frank was third. Time, 2.20 3/4.

Carroll started out ahead with Frank Krohn in the third and final heat and held it even longer than in the preceding heat. Daisy Wilkes was unable to get on terms on all well into the home stretch. Here, however, the mare's superior speed showed and she finished a length to the good, while Peter turned the tables on Fox by beating him out for second place. Time, 2.25.

There were five starters in the 2.20 trot—Ashlawn Wilkes being drawn. Daisy DeWitt went to the front at the word and held it for the first half when Sir George and Bourbon T. passed her. Sir George went to the fore and held there while Bourbon T. had to give place to the mare and finished third. Time, 2.21 1/2.

Bourbon T. secured the lead in the second heat with the others well up and at the half the four leaders could have been taken for two spots. Along the far side of the track Sir George again took the lead and won easily. Felix beat Bourbon T. out of second position. Time, 2.21 1/2.

The Boston gelding had a snap in the third and final heat and he soon pulled up in 2.20 3/4, the fastest heat of the race. Felix was again second and Bourbon T. with Daisy DeWitt beat Bourbon T. out for third place. Summary:

Canadian Northern Now Has a Sys- tem in the West Covering 2,860 Miles.

Winnipeg, Sept. 27.—During the hearing of the C. N. E. application for the expropriation of certain lands re- quired for road purposes before the Railway Commission, some interest- ing information relative to the com- pany's growth was given by Chief Engineer McLeod.

It is now stated that the mileage of the road is 2,860 miles. Of this probably 400 miles were not in con- templation a year ago, 250 miles had in the interval been acquired and the new construction had been decided upon about March last.

Business of the road had been growing a great deal faster than they had anticipated.

WINNIPEG ELECTIONS

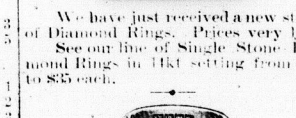
Winnipeg, Sept. 28.—The board of trade has decided to take an active interest in the approaching civic elec- tion, especially with regard to the mayor and board of control.
