London, Nov. 12.—England's optimism of an ironing out of the Russian situation was centred on important events which despatches this afternoon hinted were occurring at Moscow, recently wrested from Ealsheviki control by the Provisional Government forces.

Russian diplomats here hoped that President Rodzianko, of the Duma; Gen, Kornifoff and Gen. Kaledine, head of all. Cossack troops, now reported meeting at Moscow, would be able to form a stable government.
