the representatives being lawyers. His card declared he was in opposition to the present Gov't, and it was no more prenounced than that of Mr. Adams and others on former occasions, as at the last election all the can-didates but one were stated to be in opposition. Why Mr. Adams had travelled from one end of the County to the other talking against the Gov't of that day and yet he and Landry had joined this Gov't they had ab-used and he (Γ roy) thought they should not have done so. He was in favor of abolishing the Legislative Council, a measure advocated ever since Confederation, as also a reduction of the membership of the Legislature, and Mr. Adams had advocated both these measures.

Mr. Adams-" I did not advocate the re-

duction of the membership." He quoted from memory and Mr. Adams had said that Northumberland could be as well represented by two members, and he (Adams) was prepared to take the conse-quences, no doubt making the statement in the gushing exuberance of youth. (Laugh-ter.) The Govt had sent a delegation to Ontario to examine into the working of one house legislation, and also introduced a paragraph in the Lt.-Governor's speech in reference to abolishing the Council, but what do we find. This present Gov't had filled all the vacancies and had appointed one more than the law allows, having now one more than the law allows, having now nineteen instead of eighteen. It has been alleged that the assent of the Legislative Council was necessary before it could be abolished, if so he thought the Gov't might have left these vacancies unfilled until the vote of the people had been passed upon it as a square issue before the country. He was in favor of building the Miramichi Val-ley Railroad and thought the Gov't had not acted fairly and squarely in this matter, and spoke at length upon the small grant voted in its favor. He was opposed to selling of the Crown Lands, from which we hope to derive our revenue in time to come. It had been stated that he was brought out to split the Catholic vote and thus prevent the re-turn of Mr. Adams, but this was untrue

The Gov't should cut their coat according to their cloth, but they had erected expen-

sive buildings in Fredericton, and he de-nounced such reckless extravagance. He

thought the Gov't insincere in their action in regard to the Leg. Council, which had

now become a refuge for worn out politi-cians. He opposed land monopolies and the purchase of large blocks and he gave the Gov't credit for trying to stop this. In
