ROME. June 30. Another serious battle is reported from Tripoli. On Friday a whole division attacked the heights and vicinity, where masses of Arabs and Turks, who had escaped the previous day, were entrenched and reinforced guns aided the attacking party, and three warships bombarded the positfons Then two columns advanced for the assault, and routed the enemy with bayonet charges. The Turks left 200 dead and many wounded. The Italians captured arms, ammunition and cattle, Italian losses, 10 dead and 78 wounded. In the previous engagement, they lost 24 killed.
