

Moran Knocked Out Beckett.

LONDON, Dec. 10 .- Frank Moran of Pittsburg, knocked out Joe Beckett, the English heavyweight pugilist in the second round in Albert Hall

here to-night. In the first round Moran tried a C. J. O'KEEFE, Clothes Doctor, left lead, but was caught with a right to the jaw. Moran then led with his right and clinched. He was warned

by the referee. Beckett got in some good work in the second round and again Moran closed in, trying short arm jabs which failed to land. Moran got in a hard smash, but Beckett quickly retaliated with a powerful right to the jaw. Beckett was floored with a crashing uppercut during infighting and was counted out when he failed to rise. The end of the bout came amidst in-

ense excitement. Beckett's sudden collapse was most sensational, as up to a few seconds before he was counted out he had landed more blows than Moran by a good majority, and Moran by comparison seemed much slower. Moran was again warned for clinching in the

second round. The knockout blow was Moran's first effort at real fighting. He put all his strength into the right uppercut and sent the British champion to the boards, where he rolled over and over until counted out.
