Terra Nova Swamped With Debt.

The following despatch, ostensibly from St. John's, is taken from the current issue of the North Sydney Herald. It is truly illuminating. The above caption is that given it by the journal of publication:

St. John's, Nfid., July 4.—Customs revenue of the colony of Newfoundland for the fiscal year ended on June 20 was announced yesterday at. six million dollars, as compared with eight and a half million dollars in the previous year, and seven millions in 1918-19

In submitting the annual budget to the legislature recently, government officials estimated that colonial revenue from all sources for the year would be eight million dollars, resulting in a deficit of three millions as compared with a surplus of one and and a half millions last year.

Treasury reserve has been exhausted and the colony will operate in part during the coming year on a loan of six millions floated this spring in the United States. As the greater part of the proceeds of his loan is to be devoted to special purposes, the gov-erament has imposed additional tax-es for the purpose of raising revenue to meet general expenses. The total public debt of the colony is now fifty-one million dollars.
