"The fundamental point of distinction lies in the respect paid to the personality and to the right of a Red Army soldier. Apart from this our code is saturated with the idea that the Red soldiers and commanders are, alike, the sons of labor."

Difference to Other Armies.

What is the difference in what you call Red Army discipline and the dis-cipline of other armies?

"The discipline in the armies of all other countries is based on the suppression of the soldier's will. The discipline in the Red Army is based on the development of the soldier's consciousness."

How is the discipline in the Red Army harmonized with creative work? "The creative work in the Red Army as well as the discipline which we uphold is the result of the political-educational work which we carry on honestly and seriously in

"At the beginning of the civil war the peasants often played the role of an uncertain force. But the White Guards helped them to become the supporters of the Red Army."
