TIMMINS, March 29.—The odds are now very much in favor of McIntyre-Porcupine being able to secure two-thirds of the stock of the Penamur Mines, and to thereby swing control in favor of a deal under the terms of which this additional rich territory would be taken in with the McIntyre. The McIntyre is leading all gold

mines in Canada in point of deep developments. Miners in the McIntyre are now digging at a depth of over half a mile beneath the surface. Bodies of gold ore are larger, more numerous and even richer at depth than was the case in the upper levels. Mineralization has a tendency to rake toward the east—directly into Penamur ground which joins of the immediate east. Already the McIntyre has secured the Platt veteran claim to the immediate southwest. Given the Penamur territory, and the McIntyre, already one of the foremost gold mines in this country, will be assured of a place among the biggest in the western hemisphere, apart from its neighbor, the Hollinger Consolidated.

Solid mining opinion leans to the belief that while the Hollinger construction programme is such as to fully mature within the next year and thereby completely outdistance any local rivals, yet in the few years immediately following, the McIntyre will pass through a somewhat similar constructive period, to the end that by about 1928 it will loom up as a mine of such importance as to also make a bid for a place among the world's largest producers of gold. J. P. Bickell, president of the McIntyre, and R. J. Ennis, manager, are not displaying enthusiasm. Rather is their attitude one of confident silence, firm in the knowledge that they will ultimately unveil such a monument to Northern Ontario industry that even many of the close observers will be taken by surprise.

Trepassey Notes

Forty young men from this place will leave by S.S. Walker next week for New York, Boston and other parts of the United States to seek employment. The fact that those who left here last year for the United States have been able to send their passage money to practically all those who are now going to seek their living in the land of the Stars and Stripes, where remunerative employment is assured is an evidence that the fishery will be practically abandoned the coming summer.

The glowing report from those working at New York and Boston who left here a year ago is a strong incentive to all young fishermen to give up a calling which with high prices charged for fishery supplies make it an impossibility to continue fishing, and valuable traps, fishing boats and rooms will be left to rot.

We learn that sixty more intend leaving Salmonier and men who have followed the fishery for a lifetime are now giving it up and emigrating to the United States, some of them taking their families with the intention of making their homes there in future.

We wish them success and prosperity under the star spangled banner.—COR.

General Post Office.

Cash on Delivery Parcels.

From 1st of May, 1924, parcels addressed to places within Newfoundland which are Money Order offices, may be mailed subject to the C.O.D. Service whereby charges due to the sender up to \$60.00 may be collected from the addressee, and remitted to the sender by Post Office Money Order. The scale of C.O.D. fees is as follows:—

For sums not exceeding \$15.00	5c.
Over \$15.00 and not exceeding \$30.00	10c.
Over \$30.00 and not exceeding \$45.00	15c.
Over \$45.00 and not exceeding \$60.00	20c.

The fee must be paid by means of postage stamps affixed to the article by the sender, and is additional to the ordinary parcel postage and registration. For further particulars apply to the General Post Office.
