Dodge Brothers Set New Record

Best Previous Week in History.

American Legion to be Represented

The National Commander Will Go To
Ottawa to Greet Field Marshal
Haig on His Arrival.

OTTAWA.—James A. Drain, National Commander of the American Legion, accompanied by one other National officer, will be the official representative of United States veterans to greet Field Marshal Haig upon his visit to Canada. A telegram received by the Dominion Command, Great War Veterans' Association, from Legion headquarters at Indianapolis conveyed the announcement.

The United States delegates will arrive at Ottawa on June 29, concurrent with the opening session of the British Empire Service League conference, over which Field Marshal Haig will preside.

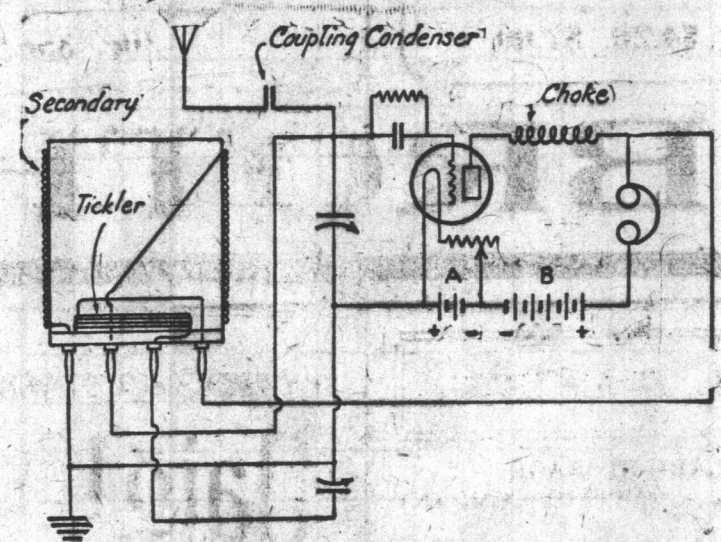

An All-Wave Broadcast Receiver A MODIFICATION

On wave lengths below 200 meters it is not necessary to have a primary winding for each coil. Sufficient coupling between the antenna and secondary or grid circuits can be provided by means of a small "coupling condenser." This condenser is nothing other than a series antenna condenser having a very, very small capacity. The antenna is connected to one "plate" of this fixed capacity and the grid side of the secondary to the other condenser plate. On the broadcasting wavelengths above 200 meters the coupling value which can be gotten by means of this arrangement is not sufficient to provide adequate transfer of energy from the antenna to the detector grid, at the same time keeping the coupling sufficiently "loose" not to seriously affect the tuning of the set.

There are three or four stations in the United States and several foreign stations broadcasting more or less regularly on wavelengths between 60 and 120 meters. In the future this number may be greatly increased. It does pay to have a short wave receiver around to listen to these stations. The ranges are enormously greater on the short waves than they are on the regular 200-500 meter waves. So if you want to permanently rig the receiver so that it will make a most excellent short wave outfit this can be done by adding the coupling condenser (shown in our figure above) and disregarding the regular primary winding entirely. This coupling condenser consists of two 1/4 inch by 1/2 inch brass angles mounted on the receiver sub base. The condensers are held in place by means of two short brass wood screws. They are mounted so that two vertical "fingers" are about one-eighth of an inch apart. The exact distance between the two angles will depend to some extent upon the length and height of your antenna and the length of your ground lead. The correct distance can be found easily by sliding the angles toward each other until the signal strength on a particular station is best.
