The Treaty of Washington,

The last note from Earl Granville to Mr Shenck in reference to the condition of the Supplemental Treaty, has been published. The British Government holds that by the article adopted by the Senate, cases of bad faith and wilful misconduct, resulting in a failure to observe strict neurality, are brought within the scope of the proposed agreement, which deals with pecuniary compensation. Earl Granville is informed that it appears to be in view of the Government of the United States that such .
