## POULTRY FOR EXPORT.

Prof. Robertson, commissioner of agriculture, and Mr. A. G. Gilbert, manager of the poultry department at the experimental farm, attended a meeting at Smith's Falls the other day. They had with them specimens of turkeys, chickens, geese and ducks, dressed in the manner suited for the British market. Raisers and shippers of turkeys were present, and said that the style of dressing was much superior to that now common among the farmers, and would give the poultry a more attractive appearance for the local markets, as well as for export. The minister of agriculture has directed that several sets of other specimens be prepared, to be exhibited to poultrymen at different centers during the next two weeks.

WEEKLY REVIEW.  
The volume of trade done on the market this week was small. The cause is easily assigned, the weather being very unsettled, and most days saw a falling off in the receipts.

The wheat situation does not seem to be improving; it is the price of the best until Tuesday, when a drop of 1c occurred, and the market closes today at \$1.10 to \$1.12.

Oats have been in good demand, and gained the bulk of their advance since Saturday. Today sales ranged from 7c to 7 1/2c for all good stock, and 7c for poor.

Peas were active and higher. Not over 100 bu were delivered all week; the prices paid were 7c to 7 1/2c.

Barley was scarce and in good demand. Only one load of rye sold, 70c being the price.

Beans sold at 50c for good quality. No buckwheat offered; demand good.

Eggs a shade easy, at 17c to 18c by the dozen in basket lots.

Butter was plentiful, the supply was quite large; pound rolls in lots brought 12c to 12 1/2c.

The vegetable market was quiet and unchanged.

Meats sold slowly, at the same old prices, with the exception of live and dressed hogs, which went up 1c to 25c per 100 lbs.

Fat was unchanged.
