THE LOCAL MARKET

Potatoes are up 25 cents on the local market this morning. They were quoted at \$3.25 to \$3.50 a bag. A few bags were offered on Saturday.

Apples have shown an increase generally. There are few No. 1 apples left in the country. Ungraded apples, a few kind offered on the local market, are selling at \$2.50 to \$2.75 a barrel.

Straw is higher, selling at \$13.50 to \$14 a ton, the highest price of the season. Although the price of live hogs has fallen nearly \$1 a cwt. since the beginning of the year, the price of dressed pork is going up on the local market. Whole dressed hogs sold as high as 21 cents a pound, and by the quarter, pork was quoted at 25 to 26 cents a pound.

Reason given by the market officials is that only a small quantity has been offered locally during the past few weeks, the demand not being filled.
