

This is announced by Premier Greenfield following a conference of his cabinet with Hon. Charles Stewart, federal minister of immigration and colonization, today, when the closer co-operation between the provincial and Dominion authorities in the bringing in of new settlers was discussed.

It is proposed, according to the new scheme outlined by Mr. Stewart, to establish a board for permanent service in connection with the immigration work, its membership to com. prise representatives of all the provinces, and preferably one man and one woman from each.
