After being temporarily detained at Ellis Island because of the quota law for their country, Baroness Boyce-Garret, Russian singer, and her husband, were finally permitted to land recently



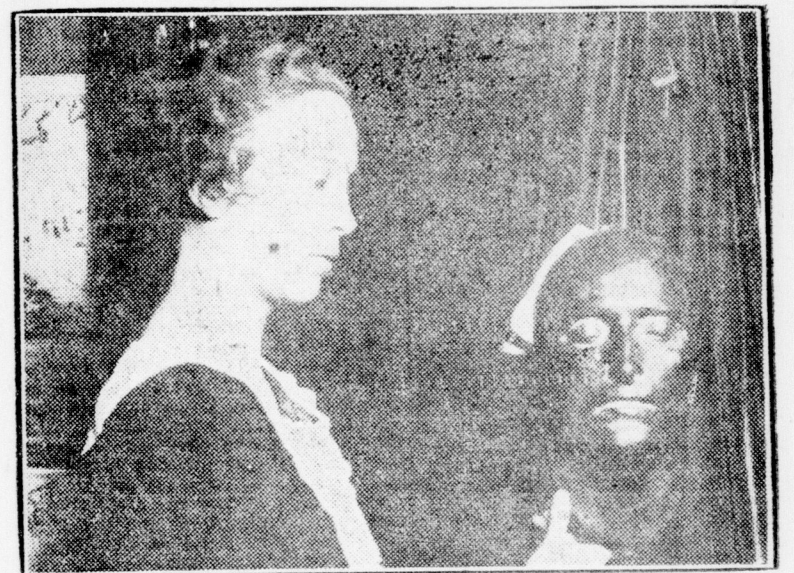

Lord Dunsany's heir, the Honorable R. A. H. Plunkett, came in second in the time-honored Eton "Mile"



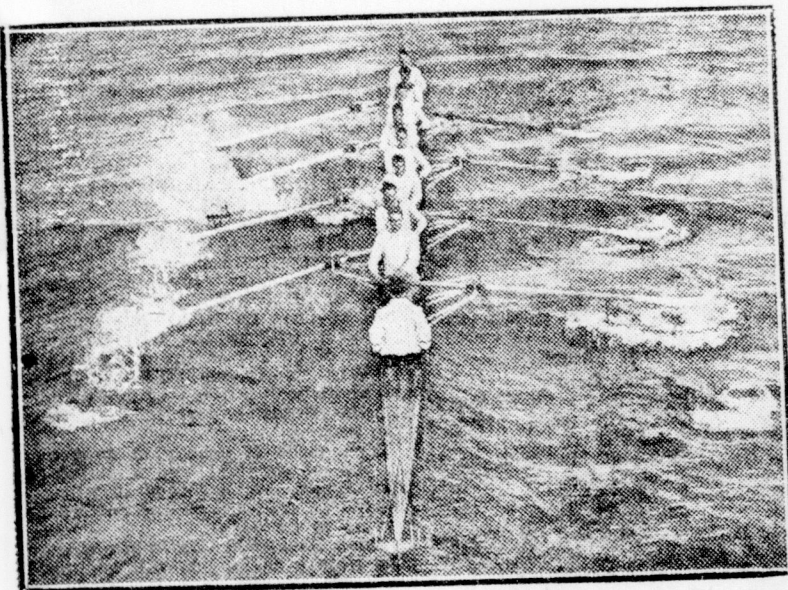

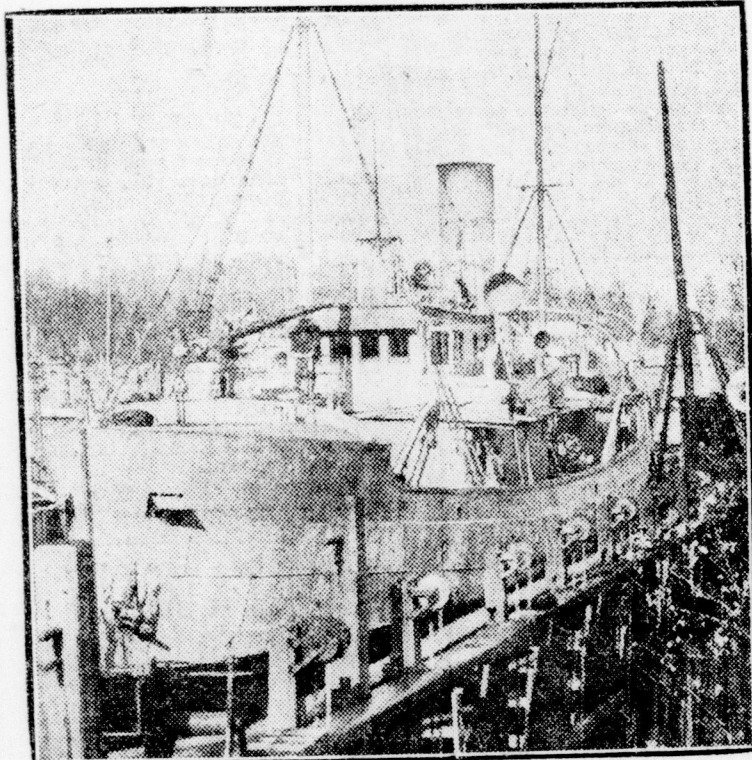

The Cambridge crew are shown after they had passed under Adelaide Bridge, below Ely, during a practice for the coming annual race against the Oxford University "eight"



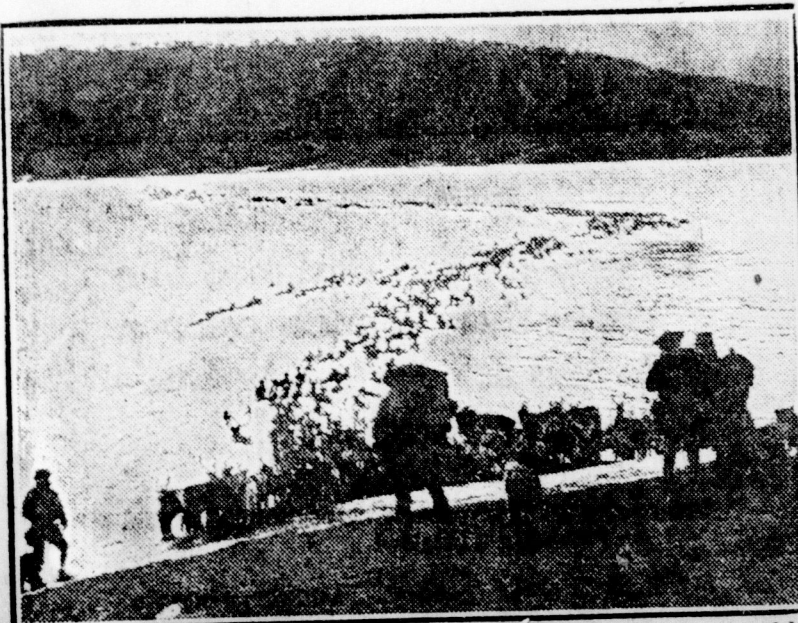

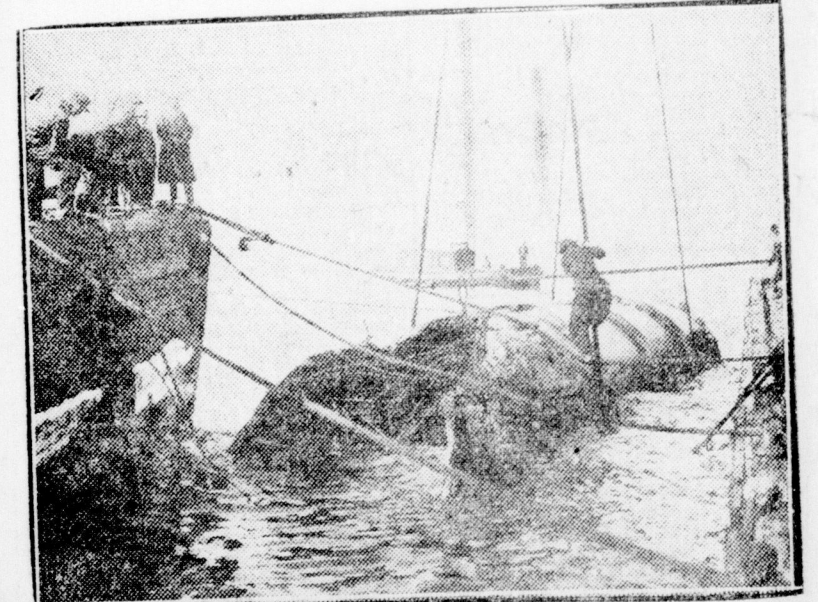
