HEAVY BLOW TO BAKER BROOK

Burning of Mill, Stores and Dwellings There Last Week.

EDMUNDSTON, N. B., May 6.—On Friday afternoon about two o'clock fire destroyed a large part of the village of Baker Brook situated fourteen miles west of Edmundston. The fire started in the mill of the Fraser Companies, Limited, at the outlet of Baker Brook into the St. John River. A strong westerly wind was blowing and the mill was soon beyond hope of being saved. Flames and burning chimneys were blown across Baker Brook, and set fire to buildings there. A number of cars on the siding at the mill were loaded with pulpwood, and about five of these were destroyed by the fire.

NEW BRUNSWICK BONDS SOLD WELL

\$2,300,000 Worth Disposed of Last Week at High Price.

Fredericton, N. B., May 8.—Tenders were opened on Saturday afternoon for the sale of \$2,300,000 Province of New Brunswick debentures to be issued under the date of May 15th. On this amount \$1,500,000 is for the purpose of permanent roads and bridges, \$1,000,000 for the refunding of the three year issue due May 15th for permanent roads and bridges, while the remaining \$800,000 will be devoted to permanent bridges. The issue of \$800,000 is to defray floating indebtedness.

The highest bids were made by the Dominion Securities Corporation, together with Dillon, Read Company. Their bid for the 5 per cent \$800,000 bonds Fredericton funds was 99.25¢ equivalent to 5.07 per cent. The bid made by these two companies for the issue of \$1,500,000 five and a half per cent seventeen year bonds, New York funds, was 102.11, equivalent to 5.32 per cent. Altogether fifteen tenders were received, the bids running high. The bonds of each issue are of \$1,000 denominations, interest payable half yearly.

GEO. S. KERR LOSES LATH MILL

Serious Fire at Teteagouche Destroys Valuable Plant.

The lath mill at South Teteagouche owned by Mr. George S. Kerr of Campbellton, which has been in operation all winter, caught fire on Sunday afternoon and was totally destroyed. The blaze was a very fierce one while it lasted, the high wind prevailing at the time making the burning mill a veritable raging furnace, and spreading the sparks and flames in all directions. Time and again the finished laths piled at some distance from the mill caught fire, and the cedar logs yielded close to the mill and the house and barns of Mr. Guy Smith were only saved by the strenuous work of a large crowd of men which quickly gathered and worked heroically with buckets. The flames caught the fence, and the dead grass also and had to be quenched by the efforts of the voluntary fire fighters or they would have done damage to properties at a considerable distance from the burning mill.

Mr. Kerr's loss is a heavy one, for although the property was insured, it is reported that the amount covered was only a fraction of the value of the mill and machinery.—Northern Light.

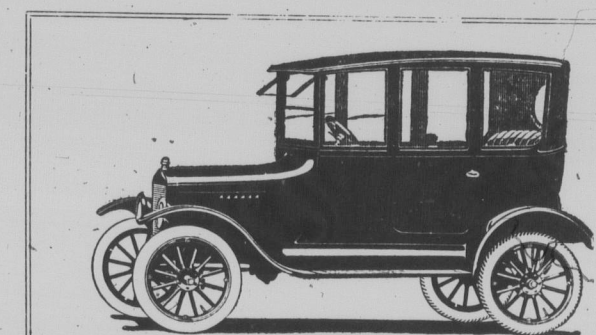
