

FIFTY-ONE MORE VICTIMS

MONTEAL'S DRATH RATE CONTINUES TO BE DEFORMOUS. Seventy-Eight New Cases of Smallpox—A Whole Family Seized at the Gravel—Ontario's Satisfactory Preventions.

MONTEAL, Oct. 23.—Official returns from the health office this morning show 58 smallpox deaths in the city yesterday, 7 in Cote St. Louis, 3 in Ste. Ceneude, 2 in St. Jean Baptiste and 1 in St. Henri.

Some four weeks ago Mr. Charles Woodruff was stricken down with smallpox and removed to the hospital, where he subsequently died. His two children also caught the disease and died, and now the poor wife and mother has been put in Longue Pointe asylum, and fears are entertained that she will not recover her reason.

There were 75 new cases reported in the city yesterday and 50 verified. The eleven cases of smallpox found at the house, 1623 Notre Dame street, last night, were all removed to the civil hospital.

Only Two Weeks Married. Ottawa, Oct. 23.—Charles Griffin, an engine driver on the C. P. R., who was married in this city about two weeks ago, has just succumbed to the smallpox scourge in Montreal. Having friends in Montreal he went on a visit to that city to spend the honeymoon. Two days after they reached there Mr. Griffin was stricken down with the leathsome disease and was removed to the hospital. It is probable that he all the possibly could for his comfort, returned to Ottawa only to receive intimation of his death.

He is well attended by every comfort. The whole of the parties in the house where the disease broke out are quarantined.
