

Pill Alophen

A mild, thoroughly efficient laxative
in colonic stasis

PILL ALOPHEN is an admirable laxative. Its specific role is to unload the colon. It is not intended for use as a brisk cathartic, but rather to relieve constipation due to torpidity of the lower bowel. Its effect is that of a slowly acting purgative. When given at night it operates nicely the following morning.

At bedtime one or, at most, two pills may be taken with the expectation of a satisfactory result the next morning. As a rule, a single pill is a sufficient dose. If the colon is much distended and atonic, one pill may be given at noon and a second at night, thus insuring a continuous mild effect.

Pill Alophen evacuates the bowel without pain, without nausea, without unpleasant sequelæ.

FORMULA

Aloin 1/4 grain
Powdered Strychnine . . 1/80 grain
Ext. Belladonna leaves . . 1/12 grain
Powdered Ipecac . . . 1/15 grain
Phenolphthalein 1/2 grain
