Mr. LUDEKING (Federal Republic of Germany):

Only yesterday, in introducing the report of the Ad hoc Committee on Chemical Weapons, Ambassador Ekeus recalled how far the negotiations had gone since he was last Chairman three years ago. He pointed out that today we have a largely developed draft text with most of the elements in place. The conclusion of a comprehensive convention banning chemical weapons -- a matter of the highest priority for Western countries -- is no longer a distant goal but a real possibility.
