The amendment further provides that time be allotted on the said network to those who oppose the united nations charter in its present form, and to those who support it, and that this time be abundant and free to those who make use of it.

It is quite clear, therefore, that this would entail the expenditure of public moneys and would necessitate a charge upon public revenues. For this reason I rule the amendment out of order.

Mr. LOW: Mr. Speaker, with all due deference to your decision, I find myself in the position of having to challenge it because of this fact: the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation is government owned.

Some hon. MEMBERS: Order.

Mr. SPEAKER: Order. The hon. member must know that the Speaker's decision is not debatable.

Mr. LOW: Then I have no alternative but to challenge your decision.
