

That is considered to be an important part of the service when we have it established. The service will include examination and educational work, emergency care and so on.

Mr. FLEMING: The minister has not yet given a breakdown of the total expenditure last year, unless that item of \$230 was the only expenditure out of \$25,000 appropriated.

Mr. CLAXTON: Yes.

Mr. FLEMING: Nor has he given a breakdown of the projected expenditures of \$18,000 this year.

Mr. CLAXTON: We have not a breakdown for the \$18,000. That is the estimate arrived at to cover items I mentioned, such as pamphlets, booklet, posters and so on.

Mr. FLEMING: I think the item had better stand.

Item stands.
