EMERGENCY GOLD MINING ASSISTANCE ACT

EXTENSION OF APPLICATION TO 1955 AND 1956

Hon. George Prudham (Minister of Mines and Technical Surveys) moved the third reading of Bill No. 190, to amend the Emergency Gold Mining Assistance Act.

Mrs. Ann Shipley (Timiskaming): Mr. Speaker, I do not wish to delay the important business of this house but I feel compelled to comment upon certain statements which have been made.

The hon. members for Cape Breton South (Mr. Gillis) and Comox-Alberni (Mr. Barnett) in the course of their remarks during the second reading of this bill stated that they were astonished that in supporting this bill my concern appeared to be solely for the mine operators and that I completely ignored the rights of the workers. Now, Mr. Speaker, if this were true I would consider it a most serious accusation because some of these miners are relatives who are very dear to me, and hundreds, indeed thousands of the others, are my very good friends.

I would like to point out that the measure before us today provides emergency aid for the gold mines. This government, in my opinion, has a responsibility in the plight the gold mines find themselves in today in that the sale of their product had certain regulations applied to it in the national interest. I tried to make it clear in my support of the bill that there was a responsibility on the part of the government. Furthermore, I tried to indicate that if the aid were not given to the extent set out in the bill there would be dire results. I mentioned that those dire results would affect the inhabitants of the community; those are none other than the miners themselves. Gold mining offers the only source of employment to these people as those of us who come from gold mining areas, and some others, realize.
