### STATISTICS CANADA—1981 CENSUS

### Question No. 946—Mr. MacKay:

How many enumerators and commissioners will be required for the 1981 census pursuant to subsection 5(1) of the Statistics Act and what remuneration is planned for such employees on an hourly or daily rate?

Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services): Statistics Canada reports: For the 1981 census it is planned that 33,924 enumerators and 1,895 commissioners will be employed under subsection 5(1) of the Statistics Act. Census enumerators will normally be paid a piece rate determined by the type of questionnaire, geography and density of dwellings. This planned piece rate is based on an hourly remuneration of \$5.43. The 1981 census commissioners will be paid \$58.00 daily for up to 75 days.
