My Dear Sir Arthur, If you remember I called upon you some weeks ago to discuss the advisability of enrolling my daughter Margery Helen Cohen at "Trafalgar". May I presume upon your time and patience a bit further to bring the situation to date and ask for your frank advice. When my wife conferred with Miss Cummings it was arranged that she was to communicate with her immediately. after Xmas, and I enclose herewith the letter that my wife received from Miss Cummings. I believe that Miss Cummings personally would be pleased to have Margery at "Trafalgar", and under ordinary circumstances, we would, of course, accept this letter purely on its face value, and, as my wife has a very high regard for "Trafalgar", we would wait for my daughter's enrollment until there was an opening for her. Margery is having private lessons with Miss Elsie McDougall in English, and French lessons with a French Governess, so that there is no hurry for her to be enrolled. However, both you and I know that there are many angles to the whole school situation, of which this may be a particular case, and I would appreciate very much any information that you feel you can give me that will enable me to make a decision. If Margery will be accepted in the ordinary way whenever there is an opening, we shall, of course, be glad to wait, but, if there is any question of policy involved, or any attitude of the Board that will prevent Margery being received because she is a Jewish child, will you be good enough to advise me? I am making this purely as a "man to man" request, and your answer will in no way entail any issue or controversy.
