WILL IMPOSE TAX FOR WAR GRANTS

Markham Township Council Decides on Levy of Mill and Half.

TO RAISE LARGE SUM

Six Thousand Dollars to Be Realized for Red Cross and Patriotic Funds.

The Markham Township Council, at yesterday's session in Unionville, decided upon a radical change in the method of raising money for patriotic and Red Cross purposes, and, instead of an appeal for funds as on a former occasion, the council will impose a straight tax of 1½ mills on the dollar, raising in all over the township the sum of \$6000. There is at the present time in the township treasury \$1500, which will be applied to this purpose, street, and another at Heintzman avenue; and from these two points the men are tunneling in both directions, constructing the sewer as they proceed. They are working east as far as Indian road, and west to Clendenan avenue.

Which will be applied to this purpose, and further sums of \$1500 will be paid the Red Cross Society at stated intervals until the \$6000 is handed over. Exclusive of the \$1500, the balance of the money will be taken out of next year's rate.
