**CITY'S LARGEST APARTMENTS STARTED**  
Will Face Queen's Park at  
Corner of Grosvenor Street  
and Surrey Place—Will  
Contain Five Hundred Rooms  
Divided En Suite and Cost  
\$350,000.

Excavating for what will be, when completed, Toronto's largest apartment house has begun at the northeast corner of Grosvenor and Surrey streets. The apartments will face into Queen's Park, about opposite the legislative building. It will be called the Athol.

With 500 rooms, magnificently appointed, divided into 55 suites, of from three to seven rooms each, with what is said to be one of the most magnificent entrances of American apartment houses, billiard room, bowling alley and swimming bath, and with lawn decorations, the building will cost approximately \$350,000. The land, which is 170 by 160 feet in extent, will cost \$25,000.

Four stories high, with towers above, an exceedingly high basement and a rather massive ornate facade will give the building a very imposing appearance. The front elevation will be solid, but the structure will have two wings and four light courts. It is easier to explain its layout by saying that it will be built in the form of a large capital E. The building will have a front breadth of 160 feet, and the wings will be 140 feet deep.

The construction will be drop-proof throughout. The floors will be of reinforced concrete and fireproof. The exterior walls will be of brick. The imposing entrance will be of stone and the effect of the ground floor will be carried through to the floor above on the exterior. Inside, the main halls and stairways will be hand decorated.

Robert H. Bullen, builder and contractor, is erecting the building. He will be the sole owner. The architects are Mallory & Thacker, a firm of young men who have made a study of apartment buildings and have already, since starting, a year ago, drawn plans for and superintended the erection of nine large apartments in Toronto.
