WINS THE STAKES

Fast Time in Grand Circuit
Races at Cleveland—Gin-
ger Lands a Heat and
Third Money.

CLEVELAND, July 30.—Promise of fast time at the North Randall track in the Grand Circuit races was fulfilled to-day. The large crowd in attendance saw records shattered, the chief performer in this locality being Braden Direct, the black colt of Baron Direct. Entered in the 2 1/2 mile race for the Forest City Stakes, with Ginger holding the reins, Braden won the second and third heats, after having finished fourth in the opening heat. He carried the hopes and money of a considerable contingent, too, being heavily backed. His best time was in the second heat, which he won in 2:08 1/2, which clipped three-fourths of a second from the stake record of 2:09 1/2, made by Ginger in the first heat, and also secured his own mark from 2:09 1/2. And, moreover, he won the world's record for four-year-old pacers—2:04—made by Online eighteen years ago.

Braden outpaced the 2:04 class, in which there were but four starters. First money in the race fell to Sir John Donnan, who was driven by Murphy in two straight heats. The bay son of the Stole was followed in each heat by Sir John Donnan, Major Brine and Peter the Second. The first heat was the most hair-raising of the meet, the four being neck and neck from start to finish. It was Sir John's first victory of the season, as heretofore he has been acting badly.

Adon (formerly Dandy G.), with Dickerson behind, back in the race in the first two heats of the three-year-old and 2 1/2 mile trotting stakes event, surged to the front in the third and fourth heats, but changing had behaved badly until then. Manrico, the favorite, was disappointed in the race.

In the 2:20 trotting, Eva Cord won in three straight heats. Gers was to have driven, but at the last moment gave way to Mr. Jones, owner of the mare. In the deciding heat she finished pulled up.
