WILL RETURN TSINGTAO

Willing, if Invited, to Aid Russia in Restoring Order, But Not Eager.

Paris, Sunday, Jan. 26 .- The Japanese delegation will, in its attitude on questions coming before the peace congress, be inspired by sentiments expressed by Viscount Uchida, the Japanese foreign minister, on the opening of the Diet at Tokio, Japan's nior delegate, Baron Makino, said to e Associated Press today. The Japanese will, first of all, contribute in every way possible to the conclusion of a just and permanent peace and neither expect nor desire any erritorial expansion in China, or Si-

beria, he said. While declining to discuss with the press any questions likely to come be-fore the congress, Baron Makino said: "Our minister of foreign affairs may be regarded as having expressed the views of the peace delegates in out-lining the broad policies of Japan. He disposed of any question as to Japan's relations with Russia by declaring that she neither intends or desires to interfere with Russian affairs, but is willing if solicited, to aid Russia in

restoring order. "Viscount Uchide gave ample as surance that Japan has no territorial ambitions in China," said Baron Makino. "On the contrary we have solemnly engaged to respect the political and territorial integrity China. Our country proposes to demonstrate she is a sincere friend of mote good will and the common wel-

One Man Killed, Seven Injured, When Huge Wave Struck Ship

Boston, Jan. 27.—The British steamer Trafford Hall, which arrived today from Calcutta and Colombo, reported the death of a Chinese sailor and injury to seven others of the crew when a great wave struck the vessel during a storm last Friday. Engineer C. H. Rawlings and several men sought shelter on the lee side of the ship when a great comber broke over the starboard side, washing the men along the deck, wrecking staterooms, smashing two lifeboats, starting seams, flooding compartments and carrying steel stanchions away. None of the passengers were hurt.
