PEARLY LECTURES TO-NIGHT ON HIS HUNT FOR POLE

Daring Arctic Explorer Will Also Tell About His Plans for Getting There Next Time.

Commander Robert E. Peary, U.S.N., the intrepid Arctic explorer, will arrive in Toronto this morning, and will be a guest at the King Edward Hotel. He knows more about the North Pole than any one else owing to the fact that he has been engaged in the work for nearly a quarter of a century, and will lecture to-night in Massey Hall on 'Nearest the Pole,' and 'Plans for the Next Campaign.'

Peary is still in the prime of life and strong and active in spite of all the hardships he has endured. He had his first big trip in 1891 while crossing Melville Bay, and lost no less than eight toes in March, 1899, owing to a bad case of frost-bites. He has endured almost absolute starvation, and been compelled to eat his dogs to sustain life. His second crossing of Greenland in 1898 showed his daring spirit when he started on a dog-drawn sled, carrying his supplies, and advanced far beyond them. Curiously enough in all his explorations his courage and servants have escaped with few casualties, but the courage, fertility of resource and physical endurance displayed by himself and his companions have avoided difficulties and disasters.

His first journey of exploration was in 1880 on inland ice. In 1891 he renewed his explorations, and remained in the Arctic regions for four years, arriving in Newfoundland in September, 1895. These two crossings of Greenland are the most brilliant geographical feats of recent years. In 1896 he made a summer voyage and brought home two large meteorites, one being the largest known in the world. In 1899 he led his four-year expedition toward the pole, and in 1905 began his most recent voyage when he advanced to the farthest north of any previous explorers. He is now firmly convinced the pole can be reached.

Dr. A. P. Coleman, professor of geology at Toronto University, will introduce Commander Peary this evening, and President Forrest of the Association of Ontario Land Surveyors will move the vote of thanks. The lecture will be illustrated by many magnificent views.

UNIVERSITY REQUIRES SOME NEW BUILDINGS. Growth of Several Departments Necessitate Additional Accommodation, Governors Say.

New buildings for the university are an urgent necessity, according to the annual report of the board of governors for the year ending June 30, 1907. After outlining the progress in construction of new buildings, convocation hall and the physics building, the report goes on to say: 'In the near future the university must look to a large increase in outlay for buildings. The rapidly growing faculty of applied science and engineering already requires additional facilities for the development of new departments. In the medical faculty there is also overcrowding, especially in the anatomical department, and provision must soon be made to meet it. With the new faculty of education and forestry and the largely-increased number of students in arts, the main building is overcrowded. The condition of the library building has been such that steps were taken last year to consider how best it might be enlarged. At present the most serious subject is at present under consideration, and the work must shortly be undertaken.'

The Faculty of Forestry. 'Another extension is urgent, occasioned by the development of the botanical department at present occupying especially in connection with the faculty of forestry, which will require very soon the building of plant houses and the laying out of botanical gardens for the initial expenditure in connection with which a sum was included in the budget of the act of 1905. The expenditure for maintenance was \$1,100, exclusive of \$4,701, which was applied towards repaying the amount withdrawn from the government fund for the completion of the physics building under the authority of an order-in-council, which the amount withdrawn was required to be repaid out of income. It is emphasized that it is a duty to keep pace with the educational needs of the province and the increase in the number of students in the various departments in the faculty of arts and the professional faculties of medicine and agriculture. The expenditure for forestry requires expensive and constantly increasing outlay for their adequate equipment and the future development of the botanical department. More on scientific lines will demand the addition of new departments.'

The revenue for the year was \$466,388. Of this \$27,459 was the income from endowment; \$184,211 was received from the fees of the students, \$128,728 represents the amount received from the purchase of books and stationery. The expenditure for maintenance of the university, \$1,100,000, which was applied towards repaying the amount withdrawn from the endowment fund for the completion of the physics building. The expenditure for forestry exceeded that of the preceding year by \$111,000, but in the past year the faculty of education, medicine and engineering, which was previously maintained by the province, became a department of the university. From January to June, 1907, \$53,547 was expended in that faculty, making the actual increase \$57,547. Of this, \$50,310 was expended in the faculty of arts; \$4,600 was expended in the faculty of education, and \$2,637 and \$575 respectively represent the initial expenditures on the new faculties of education and forestry. The largest item of increase, \$23,925, was due for salaries.

Increased Attendance. The report shows an increase in attendance as follows: 1897-8, 1353; 1901-2, 1487; 1906-7, 2647; 1906-7, 3038. These returns include Victoria College from 1901-2 and Trinity from 1906-7. During 1906-7, 894 of the students came from Toronto, and 1859 from elsewhere in Ontario. There were 53 foreign students.

License Worth \$50,000. LONDON, Feb. 24.—An interesting incident connected with Earl Grey is related here, apropos of the new licensing bill. The Northumberland magistrates granted a new public house license which Earl Grey found increased the value of the place \$50,000. This is described as the commencement of his attention to the question of district management of public houses.

The Immigrant Van Guard. MONTREAL, Feb. 24.—The annual rush of immigrants from Ontario is starting, and the first signs came this morning when a message was received from Liverpool by the C.P.R. stating that the Empress of Ireland had sailed from that port with a passenger list numbering over twelve hundred.
