Montreal reports to Bradstreet's say generally business there continues to move towards more satisfactory conditions, altho the increase in the volume of trade is by no means surprisingly large. Cool weather generally has to some extent acted against a rush of sorting orders in the drygoods trade, altho business in this connection has been fairly good. There is, however, a better feeling thruout the country, and good orders for fall lines are being placed. In some lines in which business has been heavy there is a tendency towards higher prices. Cottons and linens are particularly firm. The demand for summer dress goods has been brisk. Orders for fall linens are good. Grocers report a satisfactory volume of trade. Prices are generally steady to firm. The hardware trade is moderately busy. Weather conditions have seted against the movement of some summer lines, but builders' hardware is still in excellent demand. Metals are moving well and are generally steady to firm. The demand for haying tools and for agricultural machinery generally has been good. Country trade is fair. Produce comes forward freely at about steady prices. Dressed hogs are steady, and the enquiry for provisions is brisk. Prices are well maintained. The demand for leather is rather more active. Collections continue fairly satisfactory, with some signs of improvement noted.

Toronto reports say the outlook for future business continues excellent. Wholesalers in nearly all lines report good orders for fail, and there seems to be a tendency to stock up in anticipation of future good business. As stocks in most lines had been unusually light, this may be taken as an excellent sign.
