The circumstances under which part of this amount was collected, will be interesting. The Rector of Digby thus writes :

"I enclose £2 10s. 4d., for the general purposes of the Diocesan Church Society. The circumstances under which this small sum was raised have been very gratifying to me, and I am quite sure will afford sincere pleasure to the Committee.

"During the last year a lady who is deeply interested in the welfare of the Church and your Society, suggested to me that, perhaps, if I requested the children of the Sunday School to attempt to *earn* something in aid of the funds of your Society, it might be attended with a favorable result. I frankly confess that, at first, the expectation appeared rather visionary. But at the end of the year, several of the children delivered into my hands small packages containing "3s. 9d., for my embroidery," "2s. 6d., the proceeds of my garden," "1s. 3d. for sale of my chickens," until the money has at last amounted to more than £2, and the contributions have not yet ceased.

"This will show the estimation in which the Society is held in this Parish.

"Nor is it too much to suppose that the Church of their early exertions will be the Church of their latest affections, and that the children of other Sunday Schools throughout the Province may be led to imitate their example."
