

before removal of the timber.

4. That the scale of wages to be allowed to the Indians for cutting the timber shall be at the rate of two dollars per cord until the end of the year 1916.

5. That preference is to be given the Indians in regard to both cutting of cord wood and hauling of same.

6. That no trees under 10 inches at the stump at a distance of 15 inches from the ground are to be cut.

7. That the entire tree is to be utilized as closely as possible, and all tops and branches to be lopped off and strewn upon the ground.

8. That a deposit of Five hundred dollars shall be forwarded to the Department as security for the proper carrying out of the undertaking.

9. That this agreement shall cease and determine after the period of one year from date hereof.
