before removal of the timber.

- the Indians for cutting the timber shall be at the rate of two dollars per cord until the end of the year 1916.
- 5. That preference is to be given the Indians in regard to both cutting of cord wood and hauling of same.
- 6. That no trees under 10 inches at the stump at a distance of 18 inches from the ground are to be cut.
- 7: That the entire tree is to be utilized as closely as possible, and all tops and branches to be lopped off and strewn upon the ground.
- be forwarded to the Department as security for the proper carrying out of the undertaking.
- 9. That this agreement shall cease and deter-
