REGULATIONS.

NAME. The Society shall be called, The Nova Scotia Literary and Scientific Society.

OBJECTS. Its Objects shall be the study of the History, Natural History, and Resources of the Province, and generally the advancement of Science, Learning, and the Useful Arts.

MEMBERS. The Members shall be of three classes—Ordinary, Corresponding, and Honorary.

Ordinary Members are admitted by the Council. They must be recommended by at least one member of the Society, and chosen by ballot at the meeting of Council following that at which they are proposed, by at least two-thirds of the members present.

The payments of Ordinary Members shall be Five Pounds on admission, constituting a Life Member; or One Pound on admission, to be reckoned for the current session, by gentlemen resident in Halifax; Ten Shillings by gentlemen in the country, and the same sums annually thereafter.

Gentlemen not residing in the Province may be elected Corresponding Members, and are to be admitted in the same manner as Ordinary Members, but are not called upon for any payment, so long as they reside beyond the bounds of the Province.

Gentlemen eminent for their literary or scientific attainments may be appointed *Honorary Members*; they shall be admitted in the same manner as Ordinary Members, except that they must be recommended in a written communication
