Lt. Col. McAvity To Command The St. John Depot

Local Force Under Military Service Act to be Trained by Former C. O. of 26th Battalion—News of the Soldiers

It is understood that Lieutenant-Colonel James L. McAvity, the former commander of New Brunswick's fighting battalion, the famous 26th, will be officer commanding the depot at St. John that will soon be established for the training of men called out under the Conscription Act. Nothing official has yet been given out, but it is known that returned officers who have made application for positions as instructors to local military headquarters have been referred to Colonel McAvity.

Nothing definite is as yet known as to who will be his staff of officers, but in military circles it is said that recommendations have gone to the effect that Captain May, Lieutenant Bertram Smith and Lieutenant Charles Knowlton, of this city, will be some of the officers in charge with Colonel McAvity. All are returned officers of high repute, and should, if appointed, render valuable aid to the officer commanding.

To the Staff.

In a letter received yesterday from an officer in the New Brunswick forces in France to a friend here, the officer wrote among other things, that he had just heard that Major Alexander McMillan, who was recently decorated, and who had just been in London on leave, had been promoted to a staff position in connection with one of the Canadian brigades. Confirmation of this will be most pleasing to a host of friends of Major McMillan whose services since he went overseas have commanded warm admiration in every quarter.

New A Lieutenant.

Lieutenant Gerald Creighton, who enlisted as a private in the C. P. R. Construction Corps, in Newcastle, two years ago, has returned home on furlough. He is a son of J. D. Creighton of Newcastle. Lieutenant Creighton is in the charge of a section in the Royal Flying Corps.
