**World's Series**  
Games Are No  
Help to Baseball?

New York, Oct. 26.—Walter Trumbull  
writes in the World:  
Now that the world's series is over  
the usual outcry is being raised in re-  
gard to its desirability. There is little  
doubt that these games make few  
friends for baseball.  
This is due to the greed of the club  
owners and the players. Baseball is the  
game of the masses. The devotee of the  
theatre goes to see a play once or twice  
at most but the diamond battles are wit-  
nessed largely by the same spectators  
day after day.  
Each of these thousands of fans is  
worth anywhere from \$10 to \$50 in ad-  
mission fees to a club during the course  
of the season. They pay it on the in-  
stallment plan, 50 to 75 cents at a time,  
and so manage to see the games. "This  
is the regular source of income upon  
which a club depends for its profits."  
Then comes the world's series which  
has come to be a spectacle for the masses.  
Many a regular devotee of the game  
does not feel able to pay \$5 to see one  
game. But he cannot even do this.  
He must buy tickets for three games.  
The result is that a world's series  
crowd largely is composed of those who  
are not regular attendants at games but  
who because the advertising attending  
any big sporting event attracts them and  
because they have the money to pay the  
price. The real rooters who talk and eat  
and sleep baseball and who support it  
from April to October feel that they  
have a grievance.  
The receipts have grown to such an  
extent that they are an actual incum-  
brance to the game. Moreover, the reward  
is out of proportion to the service. Not  
even a ballplayer would be rash  
enough to assert that any member of  
the Robins actually earned \$5000 an af-  
ternoon for the work he did against the  
Red Sox.  
That baseball men themselves see the  
handwriting on the wall is evidenced by  
the fact that many of them voluntarily  
are suggesting remedies. Ben Johnson  
admits that prices are too high. Gar-

**WOULD PROHIBIT SALE**  
OF PLAYERS AFTER AUG. 1  
President of Phillies Will Start a  
Crusade Against Growing Evil

New York, Oct. 26.—W. F. Baker,  
president of the Phillies, has started a  
crusade against the growing evil in  
major league baseball. When the National  
League meets in December, Baker will  
introduce a rule prohibiting the sale of  
a player after August 1, except by the  
waiver route. Baker declared that deal-  
ers in players had been making a fortune  
calculated to strengthen the pennant  
contenders after midseason should be  
made impossible. He pointed to the  
Merkle-McCarty swap as a case in  
point.  
"I intend to make a strong fight  
against the practice of strengthening  
leading teams in the last few weeks of  
the season," said the owner of the Phil-  
lies. "It looks too much like a hippo-  
drome. If a ball team is up in the race  
the manager should be compelled to get  
along with the players in hand without  
securing others from teams that have no  
chance."  
"If the National League will adopt  
my rule such deals as the McCarty-  
Merkle transfer cannot be made after  
the first of August unless waivers are  
secured. The Brooklyn were hard up  
for a first baseman when Daubert be-  
came injured so they got Merkle, who  
undoubtedly helped them. The Glans  
lacked a first class catcher in McCarty,  
but if my rule had been in vogue it  
would have been necessary to obtain  
waivers on that player and McGraw  
might not have secured him."  
"It is unfair to patrons of the game  
to tolerate up teams in this manner and  
I believe that restrictions, such as I in-  
tend to offer, are necessary. If a major  
league manager cannot shape up his team  
properly by the first of August he  
should be compelled to take the conse-  
quences."
