REVIVAL IN PAPER INDUSTRY ASSURED

Canada's Pre-eminence in Production About to be Demonstrated.

Latest advices from the United States respecting the pulp and paper industry are that the revival of general business is creating a brisk demand for cheap (kraft) paper, and that the threatened invasion of European products is fading away to inconsequential proportions.

With competition from American mills weakening the great opportunity of the Canadian industry is now at hand. Only high war prices enabled many American producers to remain in operation, and these prices are lower than they were dropping out or going into some special lines.

Supplies of raw materials available for American mills are rapidly diminishing in any special line of industry. There is no doubt that as American pulp and paper products diminish for want of the raw materials Canada's output will supply the deficiency.

The average reader has very little conception of the enormous quantities of wrapping paper consumed in the course of a year by Canada's next door neighbor—the United States.

There are numerous mills prepared to supply the demands of the hundreds of thousands of merchants of all kinds who wrap up parcels for their customers and the American consumer has the markets of the world to draw from. It is apparent, however, that Canada has many advantages as manufacturer-in-chief of the American merchant. As time goes on these advantages will be more fully demonstrated.

Before many years the American trade will be buying the bulk of its supplies of that class from outside Canada. It is a matter of time when any country in the world and the quality of its products in the left line is unquestioned.

EXPANSION IN PAPER MANUFACTURING PROVES CONSTRUCTIVE FEATURE

Paper Man Sees Benefits to Come From Recent Years' Developments.

Rapid expansion of manufacturing facilities to meet the extraordinary demands upon Canadian industrial plants within the past few years constitutes an interesting chapter in the dominion's business development. Fears were expressed that this process exceeded requirements for years to come, and to some extent this appeared justified when slackness ensued in consequence of the deflation period. That the expansion referred to was merely hastened rather than being of special demand is now conceded, and it is beginning to be realized that all the increased productive machinery will now be required in the normal consumption of the output of pulp and paper mills in which it was installed.

It is well known that when production was at its peak the profits were correspondingly large, so that most companies were able to finance a considerable part of their extraordinary outlay out of current earnings, but it is obvious that this could not be done at the expense of shareholders, even if it had been possible. Rapid deflation was a great hindrance to permanent financing. Some companies were able to set their financial houses in order before conditions became impossible, while others have to wait for more favorable conditions to enter the money market.

The foregoing is the gist of an interview with an official of the Wayagmack Pulp and Paper Co., Ltd., which is among the companies which largely increased their productive capacity within the past few years. Wayagmack is among the foremost producers of sulphate pulp and kraft paper in the world. In the course of the past few years, 1921, this company added to buildings, plant, machinery, etc., out of its earnings, \$970,417, forming a total amount of \$1,746,422 for the last five years.

It also added to property, limits, real estate, etc., out of its earnings for the same fiscal year, 1921, \$38,488, forming an amount of \$798,116 for the last five years. A total since 1917 inclusive of \$2,544,538.

The principal items covered by the expenditure of 1921 are two new paper machines, alterations to increase the capacity of the two original machines, addition to new electrical equipment. The altered conditions of the market since these additions were authorized have not allowed the company to reap the benefit of expenditure for their installation, but the directors are confident that with normal conditions being restored, the expenditure will prove beneficial and be justified by increased production and lower cost.
